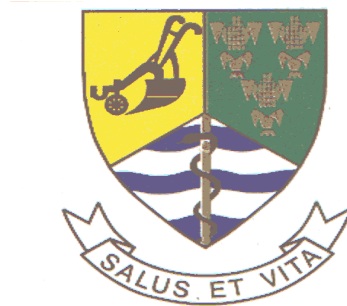

1.2 Rates Exemptions and Rebates

- a. All residential properties shall be granted R50 000 exemption on the market value and rebate of 10%. Indigents households shall be granted 100% rebate on property rates i.t.o Indigent Policy.
- b. Farms used for residential purpose shall be granted a R50 000 exemption on market value and further rebate of 30%.
- c. Bona Fide Farmers shall be granted rebate of 55%.
- d. The council shall grant additional rebate of 30% to pensioners/disabled persons i.t.o Property Rates Policy.

3.6 Town Planning and Building Plan Tariffs

The market related prices were taken into account in determining the tariffs as well as benchmarking was done with similar municipalities. The proposed tariff increase for 2026/2027 is 3.4%.
